REPORT OF THE EDITOR.

At the beginning of the year, owing to the very great increase in the expense of publication in this country, it became necessary to print the Journal in France. Expenses have been greatly cut, and it has been possible to increase the size of the 1925 volume to six hundred pages.

Delays have been due both to the distance, and to the comparatively small capacity of the presses of Protat Frères. However, the complete 1924 volume, in two issues, is now in the mails, and the first issue of 1925 was distributed in August. The other numbers of this year's issue are prepared, and waiting their turn at the press. The Negro number was paid for by Dr. E. C. Parsons.

There are two Memoirs now at the printers: Maryland Folklore, by C. C. Bullock and A. W. Whitney; Tewa Tales by Elsie Clews Parsons. They have been paid for by the authors.
