## A BRIEF NOTE ON THE MAHA LANGUAGE

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Under the heading of the Bura language group, Westermann and Bryan (1952, p. 153) include the following note: "Magha appears to be the name of a language spoken west of BABUR, of which however nothing is known." The reference is obviously to the Maha who inhabit Gulani and surrounding villages in Gujba Division in southwestern Bornu Province, Northern Nigeria, latitude 10° 45′ N., longitude 11° 45′ E. The only other reference to the Maha in the literature is by Temple (1922, p. 263) who states that the Maha ("Maga") are descendants of a small group of Kanakuru who came from Shani and settled near the present site of Gulani at the beginning of the 17th century.

The question then is whether Maha is a "West Chadic" language, Greenberg's (1963) group 1, closely related to Kanakuru, as claimed by Temple, or whether it is an "East Chadic" language, Greenberg's group 3, related to Bura as implied by Westermann and Bryan. As the accompanying word list clearly indicates, Maha belongs to the West Chadic language group but linguistic evidence does not support the assertion of a particularly close historical relationship between Maha and Kanakuru. Rather, the proper linguistic position of Maha is within the Bolewa-Ngamo-Karekare cluster.

Maha, like the other members of the Bolewa cluster and like all West Chadic languages, has separate masculine and feminine pronouns in the 2nd and 3rd person singular and one 1st person plural pronoun, there being no distinction between "we" inclusive and "we" exclusive. On the other hand, Maha is the only West Chadic language which has lateral fricatives, phonemes characteristic of the Bura-Tera ("East Chadic") group of languages. (See, e.g., numbers 11 and 67 in word list.) The occasional presence of these laterals is not surprising, however, in view of the geographical proximity of the Maha to the Babur, Bura and Tera with whom they have had considerable contact over some length of time.

The informant for Ngamo, which represents the Bolewa cluster, was a secondary school student from Kadi village in Fika Division. These word lists were collected as part of an extensive comparative study of Chadic languages which is still in progress. In this study tone has been ignored in reconstructing forms and in grouping and subgrouping languages; thus it has also been omitted in this paper, which limits itself to the genetic classification of the Maha language.
