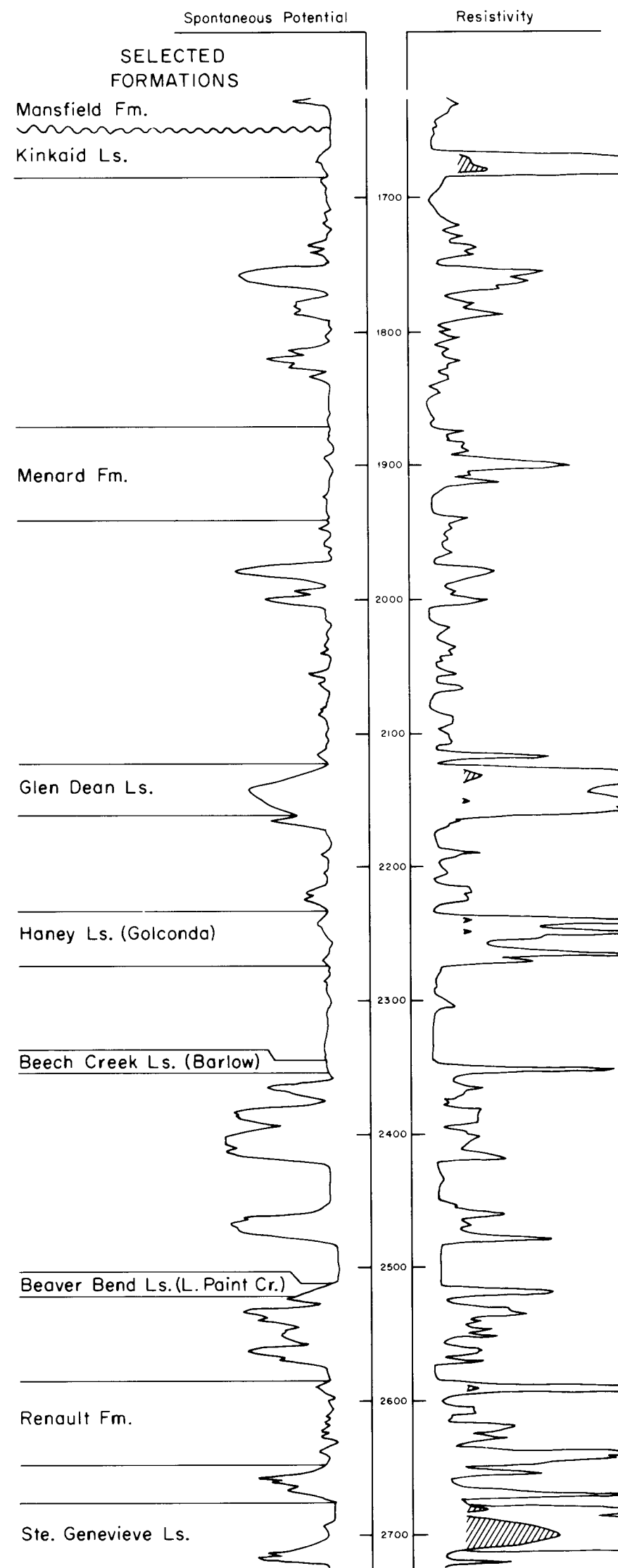


PORTION OF

EXPLANATION OF LAND GRANTS CLAIMED PRIOR TO SURVEYS ESTABLISHING THE CONGRESSIONAL SYSTEM

Number of plots within the area bounded by narrow shading are militia donations created under act of Congress, March 3, 1791. Numbered plots designated by the letter L are locations, private claims by persons displaced from donation lands. Other numbered plots are assumed to be surveys, prior claims that were ordered to be surveyed for the claimants by the 1791 statute.

For convenience in description, militia donations, locations, and surveys are assigned to congressional townships in conformity with original land-survey sheets, which show surveys numbered consecutively within each township. Arbitrary township boundaries are shown by wide shading, which is broken where boundary crosses the militia-donation tract.
