



EXPLANATION OF LAND GRANTS CLAIMED PRIOR TO SURVEY ESTABLISHING THE CONGRESSIONAL SYSTEM

Numbered plots designated by the letter L are locations, private claims by persons displaced from donation lands created under act of Congress, March 3, 1791. Other numbered plots are assumed to be surveys, prior claims that were ordered to be surveyed by the claimants by the 1791 statute.

For convenience in description, locations and surveys are assigned to congressional townships in general conformity with original land-survey sheets, which show surveys numbered consecutively within each township. Arbitrary township boundaries are shaded.
