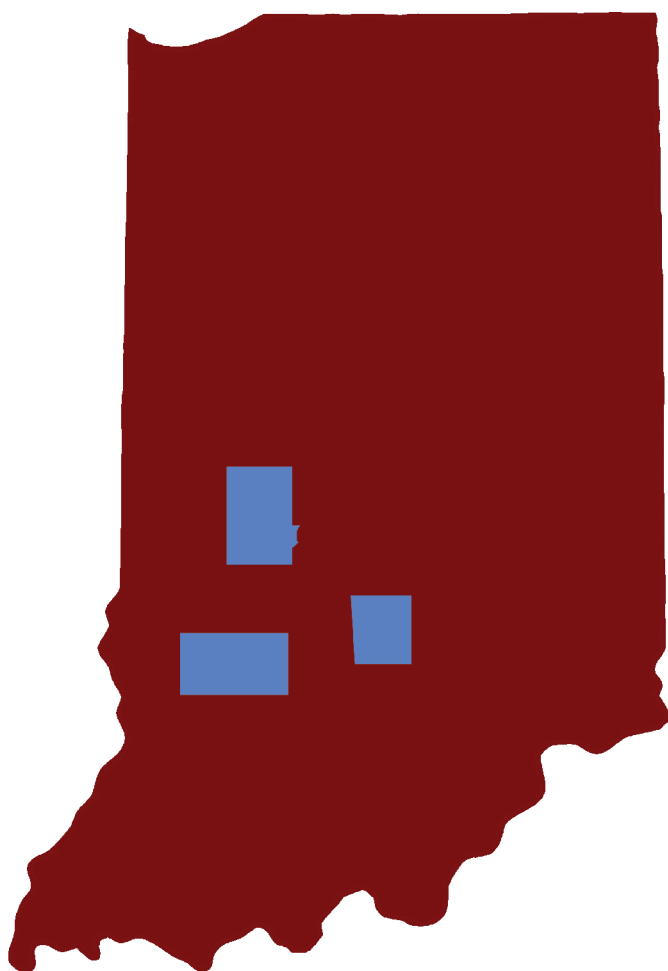

The Community Engagement to End Child Sexual Exploitation (CEECSE) initiative

at Indiana University is a partnership with Engage Together to assess current resources and educational efforts; to empower local stakeholders by identifying needs and additional resources; to initiate a strategic plan of action to address child exploitation in three southcentral Indiana counties; and to share findings to develop a scalable model for implementation across the state.

Funded by the IU Center for Rural Engagement, we reached out to individuals and organizations in Brown, Greene, and Putnam counties to identify the current efforts of healthcare, law enforcement, faith-based, and other community organizations to end child sexual exploitation and human trafficking and to support vulnerable individuals throughout their communities.

Initiated in 2020, the team also engaged with local, state, and national partners to identify current efforts, areas of concern, and best practices.

During this three-county effort, we identified strong local, regional, state, and national resources that can be brought together to support these communities and opportunities for further building efforts through collaboration. Prevention

Awareness | Demand | Vulnerability

Three key components important in preventing human trafficking are to increase awareness, eliminate demand, and reduce vulnerability of those who may be trafficked.

In order to PREVENT human trafficking, communities must be made aware that this exploitation exists and must be educated about what puts children, youth, and adults at risk. Human trafficking can occur in any community to individuals across a wide variety socioeconomic, age, gender, and demographics. Understanding and addressing factors that lead to vulnerability will aid in preventing exploitation.

Further, without demand, human trafficking would not exist. All communities must address this root problem – in the lives of individuals, in its culture, and in its laws and policies.

Identification

Training | Outreach

The next step in combating human trafficking is to take actions to IDENTIFY those who have been trafficked.

There is much work to be done in this area of focus. Those who are most likely to be in contact with individuals who have been trafficked – such as law enforcement officers, health care providers, teachers, parents, service industry workers, and others – need training to properly identify and detect potential cases of trafficking.

Outreach to vulnerable Individuals is essential to identifying potential trafficking situations and the identification and support of those who have been trafficked.

Human Trafficking and Exploitation may be difficult to identify for a variety of reasons.

After an individual is no longer in a trafficking situation, they have a number of immediate and critical needs. This may include safe shelter, medical, dental, counseling, and legal support. This can best be delivered by advocates who come alongside and link them to resources throughout the community. Increasing the availability of these resources ensures that these trafficked individuals receive the immediate and ongoing care they need.

Restoration

Aftercare | Reintegration

After an individual leaves a trafficking situation it is critical that they are provided with a number of resources that support their efforts to RESTORING key aspects of their lives. This process is life-long and requires ongoing support from trauma-informed services that are customized to the specific needs of the individual.

The range of care may include medical, psychological, familial, spiritual, educational, and vocational services. Needs differ greatly from adults to minors, and from foreign national to domestic survivors.

The end goal, however, is the same – a successful reintegration and a solid foundation upon which to build a healthy, safe, and fulfilling future.

Reforms

Legal | Policy | Systems

In addition to supporting individuals who have been trafficked, a community must also take affirmative steps to REFORM laws, policies, and entire systems that are in place to care for those who are vulnerable.

To accomplish this communities must become informed and create intentional efforts to enact laws and policies that are protective of those who have been trafficked or exploited and provide significant deterrence to harming others in this way.

It is also critically important to assess whether policies at the legislative level and within communities and businesses are addressing this issue as intended.

Another key aspect is to monitor the impact of various reforms to know whether efforts are successful or need to be further refined to correct systems that are broken, overburdened, or under-resourced.
