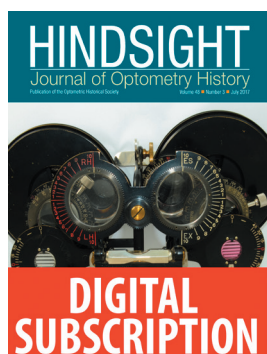


HINDSIGHT FREE TO AOA/ AOSA MEMBERS



Hindsight: Journal of Optometry History is now free to all members of the American Optometric Association! Beginning June 1, 2020 members of the AOA can access current issues of *Hindsight* through the AOA member portal. Just visit the AOA Marketplace to order the free Digital Subscription. Not a member of the AOA? You will still be able to access the most current issues of *Hindsight* at no cost. Visit the AOA Marketplace and sign up for the digital subscription as a non-member.

We hope that opening access to *Hindsight* for all AOA members will increase readership of the OHS's official publication and help to recruit more authors. As part of this effort, the OHS will no longer have a tiered membership structure with annual dues. All current members will be grandfathered in as legacy members of the OHS. The biggest change will be the way we access print issues. Instead of an annual subscription, print issues may be ordered individually through the AOA Marketplace on a per issue basis with special AOA member pricing. This added flexibility will allow you to order additional reprints of all issues dating back to July 2017. OHS members who still have issues coming to them before the expiration of their membership will receive those free-of-charge.

AOA AND AOSA LAUNCH GRANT PROGRAM FOR UNDERREPRESENTED STUDENTS



Helping open the door for underrepresented minority students interested in optometry, a new grant opportunity from the AOA and American Optometric Student Association (AOSA) seeks to promote diversity within the profession for generations to come.

The AOA/AOSA Opportunities in Optometry Grants program, supported by Optometry Cares®—The AOA Foundation, is a one-time \$1,500 stipend awarded to students from traditionally underrepresented minority groups within optometry to help defray the costs associated with applying for optometry school. Stemming from the AOA Diversity and Inclusion Task Force and the AOSA Diversity Project Team, these Opportunities in Optometry grants represent a concerted effort to not only build diversity, equity, and professional leadership for this next generation of optometry but also ensure expanded access to primary eye care throughout America's communities.
