By the time you read this, the Angel Mounds archaeological site near Evansville, owned and excavated by the Historical Society since 1938, will be in the hands of the Department of Conservation, to be administered as a state memorial for the educational benefit of the people of Indiana. The Society retains the right to continue explorations in the area, but it is expected that the Conservation Department will make some reconstructions of the old Indian village, erect a museum, and provide guides to show the public through the site. This transfer was made as a gift, after the Society had saved the site for posterity by purchasing it.
