

William Engle cast his first vote for Benjamin Harrison, being a Republican. Mr. and Mrs. Engle were members of the United Brethren Church more than forty years. William Engle was a public-spirited man, and served as trustee several times. He was interested in every movement calculated to advance the interest of the country at large or of his immediate community. He died in Washington Township, Randolph County, Indiana, December 18, 1884. He was buried at Union Chapel Cemetery, west of the villiage of Carlos. His wife, who died in 1900, was buried there also.

The family of William and Lutitia Cabe Engle has entered its sixth generation (1951-1953), spreading over Indiana, the Southwest and West. The three immigrants who crossed the Delaware River into Pennsylvania have spread their name all through Pennsylvania and through Ohio, in Sidney, Piqua, Dayton, and elsewhere throughout the state.
